### 3 Day - Sevilla and Tarifa's Atlantic Coast

Seville is the Jewel of Andalusian culture and history. For students, it's a fascinating city that intrigues every imagination. We explore the best Seville has to offer! On return from Sevilla we find Bolonia's Roman Ruins, Tarifa and the National Park of the Gibraltar Straits. Here we have some days of culture and adventure fun in unspoiled nature. This balanced program will satisfy cultural & educational areas with some brilliant natural, outdoor experiences.

**Day 1 CULTURAL SEVILLE** – Private coach transfer to Seville with guided educational visit to the Alcazar Palace and the Barrio Santa Cruz – including Plaza España and the Botanical Gardens Maria Luisa. Late afternoon check into hotel. Dinner at hotel. Night program includes light Team Building Challenges & social games with your Adventurebug Leader.

- 0900 Departure by coach from School / stop on route for toilet and refreshments - bring pack lunch today
- 1300 Arrival to Seville and visit the Alcazar Palace and Barrio Santa Cruz. Packed lunch in shaded area.
- 1500 Tour the Barrio Santa Cruz with our guide.
- 1700 1 hour free time for exploration in small groups in the tourist region of Barrio Santa Cruz. Following this we walk to the Plaza España and Maria Luisa gardens before transferring to the hostel by bus.
- 1800 Transfer to the Hostel (10 min) / settle in time / orientation
- 2000 Dinner in Hostel followed by evening games and challenges led by Adventurebug

**Day 2 BOLONIA ADVENTURE DAY** – Morning transfer 2 hours to Bolonia's Roman Ruin site, Baeno Claudia and the beautiful natural dunes of the Atlantic coast. After we visit the historic quarter of TARIFA village and continental Europe's most southerly point. \*Later this afternoon, time permitting we may visit the interpretive center of the Alcornocales Natural Park at Huerta Grande (\*pending group timings).

- 0800 Breakfast in hostel
- 0845 Load bus and depart for Bolonia on the Cadiz coast (2 hr 20 min approximately)
- 1200 Visit to the Roman site of Baeno Claudia (1.5 hours) and swim in the Ocean at the dunes! Picnic lunch
- 1400 Visit Tarifa Pueblo and the most Southerly point of continental Europe.
- 1800 Approximate arrival time to the Hostel at Tarifa / check In / safety orientation
- 2000 Dinner in hostel followed by evening games and challenges on the sports areas provided

**Day 3 TARIFA ADVENTURE DAY** – Morning transfer 25 minutes followed by Multi Activity Day in Tarifa and the Estrecho Natural Park. Activities include small group rotations of: Rock Climbing, Cave Necropolis Trek, Rappel, Archery and more. Beach swim pending weather conditions.

- 0800 Breakfast in hostel then load bus and depart for Punta Paloma on the Cadiz coast (25 min approx)
- 1000 Adventure activities in small group rotations of each activity / beach dunes walk.
- 1600 Picnic on site / completion of Adventure program. Return journey to School.

Coach company is fully licensed (with school placard) and all seats have seatbelts

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## SAFETY EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

The information below is to assist teacher leaders and monitors with managing risk and potential hazards on our trips. It also offers practical advice in the event of emergencies and provides a resource base of contact numbers to rescue personnel. In the event of any emergency it's important to stay calm, get all the facts and be sure that you and the other children are safe and accounted for.

### Recommendations for Safe Practice on School Adventure Trips:

1. Ensure a **FIRST AID** kit is carried on all days (Adventurebug will always have one)
2. Teachers and Activity Monitors set safety boundaries for children and give warning to any possible hazards including weather patterns, terrain, wildlife, road hazards, public areas and any items of nature that could be a danger.
3. Communication system in place between groups and their supervising leaders and teachers – exchange mobile phone numbers and have a central meeting point each day that everybody is familiar with.
4. Always watch out for one's personal safety in areas of outdoor pursuits and double check on fellow peers when doing activities.
5. Keep within boundaries and respect monitor's judgement and authority.
6. Ensure that an escape route / plan is in place and / or provisions for repatriating an injured or sick from an activity site.
7. Respect all safety equipment and installations.

### In the event of any accident or serious illness scenario:

If working with the Adventurebug monitors on activities – tell them what has happened and they will launch their own emergency procedures. If not: Provide any necessary First Aid to casualty & call in further Emergency Services if necessary. Our first line of assistance is:

Medical services – call Euro emergency number 112

Rescue services – call Guardia Civil 062

Criminal scenario – call Guardia Civil 062

Ensure the rest of group is together and not in any danger. If hospital services required, 1 staff member and then appropriate a parent or guardian, accompany patient to hospital. **INSURANCE AND REGISTRATION FOR A PATIENT.** Adventurebug has an internal medical emergency policy to speedily register with the Spanish National Health Service. Our insurance policy (and because they are minor in age), ensures they get prompt treatment from emergency services care. **PLEASE HAVE A DOCUMENT WITH THE STUDENTS NAME, ADDRESS AND FAMILY DETAILS** available! Ensure a Spanish speaker is present (*teacher or designated adult preferred*). Based on severity of incident, decide how to best carry on activity session with group.

### In the event of a lost person:

1. Ensure all other members of group are accounted for first.
2. Get as much information regarding location person last was seen.
3. Contact supervising monitor to advise.
4. Follow instructions of supervisor.
5. Keep rest of group in one place under adult supervision.
6. Should person not be found within 20 min / and depending on environment / call emergency services (Guardia Civil) for support.
